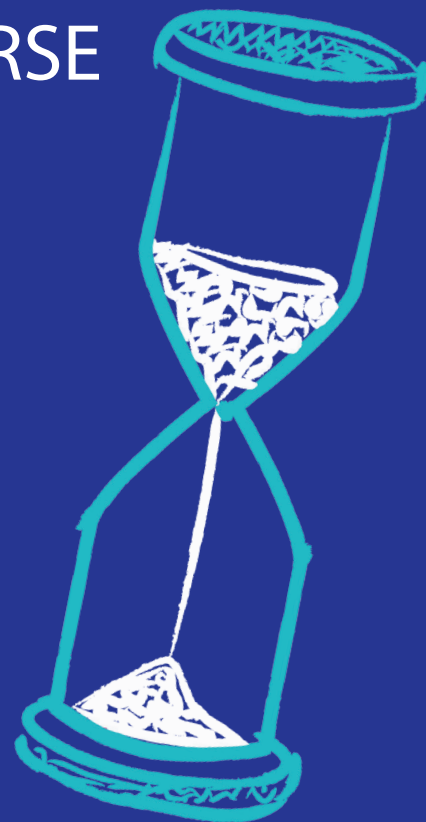


Final Countdown to Statutory RSE
